

Contest Rules

Entries may be stories, poems, essays or artwork about **“Together”**

- Each entry must be the original work of a student currently in **grades K through 12.**
- Written work should be no longer than 350 words.
- Artwork should be **NO** larger than 18" x 24."
- Each entry must have complete information printed on the back: Student's Name, Address, Phone Number, School Name, Teacher's Name, and Grade Level. Home-Schooled students should write "Home-Schooled" in place of a school name, and must include their grade level.
- All entries become the property of Parents And Children Together. Submission of an entry implies consent to have the work published.
- **DEADLINE for entries is 4:30pm by Wednesday, April 4, 2018.**

Suggestions for younger students:

Younger students may need more coaxing to unleash their imaginations, and often the most creative pieces start from very simple ideas:

- “E hana like kakou me ke aloha, “Let us work together with love.”
- Who is your “together” buddy? Friendship—what qualities or behaviors make a good friend? How does a good friend behave?
- It is much easier and faster when you do things together. Can you give an example? Does anyone ever ask you for help? What is it like doing something by oneself or doing with the help of another?
- ‘Mo bettah’ together – what does this local saying mean to you?
- If we work together we can make a difference.
- When individual sticks are bundled together, they are harder to break – how does this relate to “together”?

Suggestions for older students:

- “E hana like kakou me ke aloha, “Let us work together with love.”
- Together we can make a difference.
- Working together for a common cause.
- ‘Mo bettah’ together--what does this local saying mean to you?
- “We must learn to live together as brothers or perish together as fools.” – Martin Luther King, Jr., American Civil Rights Leader.
- “Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much.” Helen Keller, American author, political activist.
- “Great things are done by a series of small things brought together.” – Vincent van Gogh, Dutch Artist-Painter.
- “A dream you dream alone is only a dream. A dream you dream together is reality.” – Yoko Ono, Artist.
- “Individually we are one drop. Together, we are an ocean.” – Ryunosuke Satoro, Japanese Poet.
- The strength of the team is each individual member ... the strength of each member is the team.” – Phil Jackson, NBA basketball coach.
